#### **Materials in Common Areas**

- ➤ A consistent position for storage, removal and enforced prohibition of combustible materials in common areas to be agreed by stakeholders (including SFRS and Local Authorities)
- >A fire safety campaign relative to common areas

#### Overview

The Scottish Government is gathering information and views on proposed actions to strengthen **fire safety for people who live in high rise domestic buildings**. We will use the responses to improve and refine the proposed actions on strengthening fire safety in high rise domestic buildings. The proposed actions are aimed at delivering the five recommendations from the *Review of the Fire Safety Regime for High Rise Domestic Buildings in Scotland.* These were agreed by the Scotlish Government Ministerial Working Group on Building and Fire Safety that was set up following the tragic fire at Grenfell Tower. There is separate work underway regarding the sixth recommendation to produce fire safety guidance for specialised housing.

# Why is guidance needed?

"the projected increase in the number of older people and the number of people receiving social care or care in the community are also recorded as key contributory factors"

(Scotland Together, 2009)



"The over 60s account for the highest number of fire deaths across the various age groups with multiple contributory factors often present eg. smoking, sensory impairment, mental health, medication, mobility, social isolation"

(SFRS Aging Safely Framework, 2015)



"it was highlighted by the Advisory Group that there was not a lot of easily accessible, informative, fire safety guidance aimed at those responsible for managing specialised housing. In particular, there was a lack of guidance related to the consideration of the needs of vulnerable people."

(SG Review of the Scottish Fire Safety Regime for Domestic High Rise Property, 2018)


