Climate Change and Sustainability

Programme Day One Thursday 4 February

This is a key year on the journey to net zero; the Scottish Government has now published its Heat and Buildings strategy and an update to its Climate Change Action Plan. The end of the year will also see Glasgow host COP26. The social housing sector is already leading on addressing climate change and promoting sustainability.

This conference will provide an opportunity to look at best practice and lessons learned – as well as discussing how social landlords can do more, including with support from SFHA and our key partners.

Breakout one: Electric vehicles
Sandra Lindsay & Craig Veldon, Springfield

Scotland's decarbonisation means that electric vehicles (EVs) are becoming more and more commonplace – which has design considerations for housing developments. This session will look at best practice for including EV charging points within plans, including how to avoid maintenance and management issues further down the line.

Breakout two: Existing Homes Alliance Gillian Campbell, Existing Homes Alliance; Duncan Smith, Renfrewshire Council

The end of 2020 saw the publication of some key documents from the Scottish Government which are of significance to the sector, including an update to the Climate Change Action Plan and a policy statement on hydrogen. 2021 will also see the Heat in Buildings Strategy and the long-awaited Fuel Poverty Strategy. This session will provide an overview of what's in some of these key documents and discuss the work of the Existing Homes Alliance in this area, a key partner of SFHA.

Breakout three: Tenement retrofit
Patrick McGrath, Southside

John Gilbert Architects

Retrofit of existing stock is a key challenge for RSLs, particularly as more government standards and regulations are brought forward as we aim for net zero by 2045. Certain property types pose bigger challenges than others – tenemental stock being amongst these. A project commissioned by Southside Housing Association in Glasgow, and led by John Gilbert Architects, will see the retrofit of an entire tenement block to the Enerphit standard – and offer key lessons and insight for others grappling with this issue.



With 12 years to meet the challenging 2032 Energy Efficiency Standard for Social Housing post-2020 (EESSH2) target, Changeworks is taking a lead role in supporting housing associations to shape a more strategic and holistic approach to future proofing the existing housing stock and supporting tenants. This session will cover key considerations for maximising the effectiveness and impact of installations, strategic asset management and tenant engagement.








Virtual Conference FAQs

SFHA Live! Housing Now, Housing's Future is hosted by Crowdcomms virtual conference platform. Below you will find some advice to help you get the most from the platform.

What is an SFHA Live! virtual conference? Live and recorded sessions, virtual Q&As, chat and polling will create an innovative, interactive and engaging digital conference experience. You can access on demand content from virtual conferences for three months after the event so you can watch at anytime and anywhere that's convenient to you.



Internet Browser

- For best results, please use Chrome, FireFox or Edge.
- To visit the Sponsors' Lounge, you will need to be using an up-to-date version of your browsers.
- The latest versions of Chrome, FireFox, Edge (Chormium) and Safari 14+ are all supported.
- Safari is the only supported browser for IOS devices.
- Older browsers such as Internet Explorer are not supported.

- On the left-hand side menu, click on the tab called 'Agenda'
- Click on the session you want to watch
- Watch the live stream!

What if the streaming link doesn't work?

- We recommend you take a moment to check the link is working and familiarise yourself with the platform before the event.

Missing Q&A, Polling and Feedback Buttons
