

<u>Green infrastructure</u> is the green and blue features of natural and built environments and the connections between them that provide benefits for people and nature.

Includes: Parks, woodlands, trees, play spaces, allotments, community growing spaces, outdoor sports facilities, churchyards and cemeteries, swales, hedges, verges, green roofs and gardens. Blue features include rivers, lochs, wetlands, canals, ponds, porous paving and sustainable urban drainage systems.

Connections: Paths, cycleways and green corridors such as rivers







Project Aims - to demonstrate:

- The value of green infrastructure in creating attractive and distinctive places to live
- Benefits of considering green infrastructure <u>alongside</u>, rather than <u>subsequent to</u>, housing and other infrastructure
- Benefits of closer, more meaningful partnership working and community engagement
- There is a sound business case for better green infrastructure, particularly with respect to 'wider role' of the sector
- Client needs (no. and type of dwellings) can be met whilst maximising the benefits of green infrastructure within an existing/ allocated construction budget
- Design and process lessons that can be applied to other projects and shared widely




Project Design















What kind of proposals are we looking for? – location, nature, scale

- regenerate areas of multiple disadvantage current lack of accessible, good quality greenspace in the local neighbourhood
- no minimum or maximum size
- sites that include or are likely to include some significant areas
 of shared open space capable of supporting a range of
 functions that would benefit people & nature
- could be small, constrained sites with opportunities for innovative designs (e.g. green roofs and green walls)
- green infrastructure addresses constraints such as surface water issues, noise and air pollution, car parking provision, landform
- commitment to embrace best practice promoting the principles in Scottish Government guidance
- no 'show stoppers'



What kind of proposals are we looking for?

Timing, Process, Delivery

- Developed Designs & Costings (approx.RIBA Stage 3) by end of f/y 19/20
- Built-out and occupied within 2-5 years of finalising design
- Partnership with the community and with existing or prospective tenants
- Opportunity for meaningful partnership and co-production of designs with other relevant stakeholders (e.g. Scottish Water, Health and Social Care Partnerships).
- Sites where a design team have already been appointed to a fixed brief less likely to be successful.
